



BRIEF HISTORY

William Henry Quilliam - born 10th April 1856 in Liverpool. Educated at Liverpool Institute and after qualifying as a Solicitor he went to Morocco where he became profoundly interested in Islam. 1887, aged 31 he became a Muslim taking the name Abdullah. Abdullah Quilliam was a dynamic personality in Liverpool where he preached Islam and established the Liverpool Muslim Institute. He died in 1932 and lie buried beside well known personalities such as Abdullah Yusuf Ali and Muhammad Marmaduke Pickthall, both of whom had translated the Holy Qur'an.

Abdullah Quilliam founded Britain's first Mosque and Institute in Liverpool in a small semi on Brougham Terrace, West Derby Street, in 1889.



PRESENT ON GOING PROJECT AND ACTIVITIES

Restoration of the original historic Mosque which was in use from 1889 to 1908 at No.8 Brougham Terrace on West Derby Road.

Establishment of a fully functional Mosque as soon possible.



FUTURE PLAN

Once completed, programmes will include a fully functional exhibition centre creating better understanding between muslims and non-muslims.

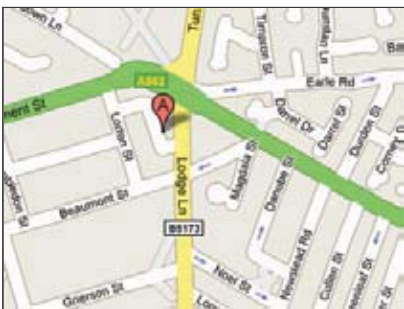
An archive and heritage museum documenting Islam in Britain and its history.
